

Colin Godmans Fishery, near Danehill, East Sussex, consists of three lakes in a natural valley with the smallest, Bellapool, at the top, Starton (above) in the middle and the largest lake, at three and a half acres, Bircheham (right), at the lower end of the system. Stocked with browns and rainbows, the fishery totals approximately seven acres and is bounded by open pastures on the north side and mixed woodland on the south side.





OPEN: 1st April to 31st October. Fishing from one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset. Please see the Trout Section Code of Conduct for permitted fishing methods and Trout Section Regulations that apply to all waters.

DIRECTIONS: From the junction of the A272 and A275 at North Chailey, head north on the A275, past Sheffield Park, then 1.1 miles after the park entrance, turn right at Furner's Green. Take the first right after 0.8 miles, then the next right and the next right again. Parking is in the marked designated area only - cars may not be taken down to the water. From the car park, take the track downhill from the barn on right as you approach the house. The Returns Book is in the farm manager's office next to the barn. It must be filled in before fishing and when finished, entries must indicate in which lake fish were caught. Members may use the

indicate in which lake fish were caught. Members may use the facilities provided in the office, including the toilets – please leave everything in a clean and tidy state. There is a stock of a small tropical species called pumpkinseeds. If caught, please do not return. This is a non-native species and we are obliged to eradicate it.

Colin Godmans is a working farm

and members must avoid disturbing livestock or damaging crops.

Due consideration and courtesy must be afforded to the owners, their family and employees at all times. Early arrivals or late departures must be made quietly. The owners reserve the right to use the lakes for their own recreation, especially during the warm high summer period when they may wish to swim or boat in the lower lake
