## **Lower Buddington** Steyning


## OS MAP: TQ163123



Lower Buddington is a banks only fishery set under the South Downs, near Steyning. Fly hatches consist of many varieties of buzzers, along with sedges, damsels, gamarus and a few pond olives. You may also spot a few stone flies. During the late Spring and early Summer there can be prolific daphnia colonies. The water is well stocked with rainbow and brown trout of varying sizes.









## SAT NAV: BN44 3DA

**OPEN:** 3rd April to 31st October. Fishing from one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset. The season may be extended if conditions allow. Please see the Trout Section Code of Conduct for permitted fishing methods.

**DIRECTIONS:** Lower Buddington shares access and parking with Wiston. Access is off the A283, just north-west of Steyning; the A283 joins the A27 at Shoreham to the south or the A24 at Washington to the west. The entrance (*below*) is on the south side of the road, two miles from the Bramber Castle round- about at Steyning or 3.2 miles from the Washington roundabout. There is a short approach to the SPS padlocked metal gate - care should be taken as traffic is notoriously fast. Pass the overflow car park inside the gate and drive down across the dam to the Wiston car park, beside the fishing hut compound. Sign in at the hut in the appropriate book and continue on foot through the small gate just to the left of the compound and on to the field track for 200 yards southwestwards. Pass through the metal field gate and then enter the lake area through the small wooden gate on the western side of the lake. Please ensure that all gates are closed immediately after use. Fishing above the wooden footbridge (left) is not permitted.

Kindly note that there is no entrance from Mouse Lane to the south and sat nav users should be aware that the postcode reference given above is for a number of properties in the surrounding area and not specifically for the water.
